

How to report hate crime

1. Call Greater Manchester Police on 101. If it's an emergency always call 999.
2. Report online using the True Vision website:
<http://www.report-it.org.uk/> or download the self-reporting form and send this to your local police force. Forms can be found on the 'Report a hate crime' page.
3. Visit a reporting centre. These are independent, non-police centres that allow you to report events in total confidence. A list of all the third party reporting centres in Manchester is available to download from:
www.makingmanchestersafer.com
4. Call Crimestoppers on 0800 555111 or visit their website www.crimestoppers-uk.org You do not have to give your name and what you say is confidential. Please note: With your details the incident can be investigated fully but without your details the report will be used for monitoring purposes.
